In terms of structure, sentences can be classified in four ways: Simple: one independent clause. Compound: at least two independent clauses. Complex: an independent clause and at least one dependent clause. Compound-complex: two or more independent clauses and at least one dependent clause. Classifying Sentences By Structure 7th Grade Worksheets ... A complex sentence contains at least one independent clause and at least one dependent clause. Dependent clauses can refer to the subject (who, which) the sequence/time (since, while), or the causal elements (because, if) of the independent clause. If a sentence begins with a dependent clause, note the comma after this

clause. Sentence Structure and Types of Sentences - Grammar ... A complex sentence contains a subordinate clause and an independent clause. A subordinate clause is a group of words that has a subject and a verb but does not express a complete thought. Here's a sentence diagram of a complex sentence. Note that there are still two horizontal lines, but one of them is below the other and moved to the right. Sentence Structure: Learn about the four types of sentences! When contemplating sentence types, you should consider two things: the function and the structure of the sentence. When we consider the function of the sentence, we are primarily concerned with what punctuation ends the sentence. When we consider the structure of the sentence, we are interested with how many clauses are in the sentence.
